

Controlling and Coercive Behaviour

Delegates will understand what coercive control is and its function within an abusive relationship, the effects and impacts on those who experience it, what types of abuse are involved and how they can support victims/survivors and refer to specialist services.

- Ensure thorough understanding of the new legislation.
- Improve the agency response when working with those who have experienced CCB
- Increase awareness of how agencies can support with building a case of CCB.
